Message from President Elsa WONG



Globally, the number of daily reported new cases of COVID-19 reduced substantially. While we look forward to the pandemic being over ASAP, let us not forget that irreversible damages have happened and things would never be the same again. We shall continue understanding

what our community needs in serving above self.

Not long after issuance of April's bulletin, our remaining facemasks arrived into Italy, Australia and New Zealand. In the past month, we remained active to address issues caused by the outbreak. Through PDG CP Dr. Eric, we got connected with CP Dr. Nischal PANDEY from Rotary E-Club of Connect D 3012 on joint international service project "Helping families with ration." Due to lockdown in India, countless families had no money to buy food. This project joined hands to serve people with basic amenities including wheat flour, rice, salt, cooking oil, lentils and milk. These amenities were directly delivered to people in need and supported feeding families in hunger.

In HK, to prevent catching COVID-19, many elders were constrained at home. This prompted the problem of limited exercising opportunities which totally disrupted their normal daily lifestyle. To overcome such obstacle, together with our Rotaract Club, we partnered with Community CareAge Foundation ("CCAF") to address such issue. We donated survival pack containing videos of home-exercises which educates ways to do workout. Many thanks to the Rotaractors who did the video and voice recording, CCAF totally loved it!

Last but not least, in continuation with the mentorship program, our mentors actively engaged mentees to equip them with knowledges to prepare their careers. The discussion included specialization in job function, how to

improve CV, Key Performance Indicators, professional qualifications and insider best practices. We were very impressed with the caliber of mentees and look forward to further expanding this Youth Service Program next year.

Same as last month, we continued monthly meeting via Zoom's platform. The speaker was our PN Carlos TAM whom shared on the topic of "*5G Era for Tomorrow*." The talk was very rich in terms of breath and depth which stimulated meaningful questions being asked. Also, it got our member's imagination flowing. Personally, I feel Carlos gave us the hope that 5G will allow us to take one giant step towards *Star Trek era*.

While gatherings were not encouraged during this period of time, it was interesting to note that several of our Rotarians incidentally bumped into each other. As good citizens, we respect our government and keep to less than 4 people mingling at a time as well as social distance of at least 1.5m when standing next to each other, whenever we can.

On 21st May, Rtn. Dr. Derek CHUNG will be talking on "Digital Transformation in Banking Industry." Look forward to seeing you all in Zoom's platform again then!

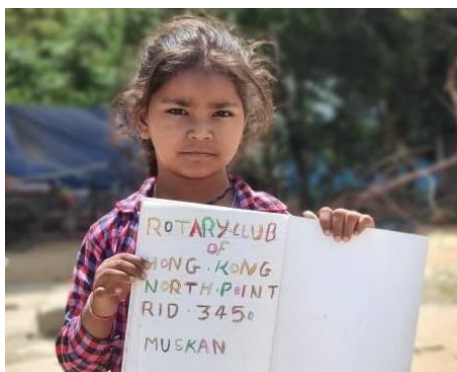
I shared some stationery shared by Rotary friends from Japan & USA. It's a perfect example on how Rotary Connects the World and reach to help people in need.

CARING FOR FAMILY OF GURUGRAM MAN WHO SELLS PHONE TO BUY FOOD FOR FAMILY AND THEN HANGS HIMSELF

In awareness of the heartbreaking tragedy in Gurugram, we united to serve.

"PDG CP Dr. Eric & President Elsa

The sole bread-earner of family, Mr. Mukesh (around 30yo), used to feed his family through daily wages jobs hanged himself as he was not able to support his family of five:

*Wife: **Poonam** (25yo)*

*Daughters: **Sonia** (8yo) & **Kajal** (2yo)*

*Sons: **Golu** (3yo) & **Ravi Kishan** (6 Months).*

This incident touches you deep as this man sold his Cell Phone for INR2500 (US\$32) to buy a fan and food for family and hanged himself to death as he was not able to support his family any more. This makes us cry as family was so close to our place and we are feeding families from day 1 of lockdown and we have seen so many happy faces but we could not connect to this family. Children even do not have proper clothes to wear.

People collected funds to make last riots of Mukesh and family has left with nothing, no food, no future for children.

We need to help them with funds and help them open a bank account so that we can help them in future and may be some vocational training for this lady Poonam to support her children like some stitching course and we can provide a sewing machine later.

Long road of survival but I am sure together we can bring some smiles back on their faces.

Thank you so much RC Hong Kong North Point and all members for helping us to take this forward and inspired us as well to find the family and finally we are reaching them.

CP Nischal wrote:

"Good Evening Sir, finally met with the family. Cannot explain my emotions, a sad feeling to see that family with God only to support and perhaps you are one of the God's messenger to motivate me to find this family.

Maybe we can have a sustainable plan to support this family for 6 months or 1 year subject to your proposal Funding. I think we shall unite to create lasting impact to this family.

Today apart from financial help, I shared ration for the family as they looked hungry and trying to arrange cooking facilities. I couldn't discuss much today as they were in shock and they were so thankful that we reached."

PDG CP Eric wrote:

"Short, Middle and Long term support for 1 year. We will put in 2020-21 year plan. Our PE Colin agreed to support."

CP Nischal wrote:

"I have arranged a cooking stove with LPG connection for family as they have to burn dried tree debris to cook food"



DEFENDING DOWNUNDER WITH OUR INTERNATIONAL PARTNER IN AUSTRALIA, RC OF DONCASTER (MELBOURNE), AGAINST COVID-19

On 17th & 18th April, thanks to PDG CP Dr. Eric's connection in IFFR through PP Mike MCFARLANE (AUS) & PP Ern DAWES (AUS), 3,000 facemasks arrived in Australia with 800 facemasks sent to Timor Leste via Australia Embassy. Below were messages from PP Ern DAWES:

"Dear Eric,

DHL delivered 2,000 face masks to my company yesterday and these were collected by Rotarian Esther Murray from Peninsula Health today. The remaining masks are expected to be received next week.

We have been approached for a quantity of masks by Mission Aviation Fellowship who fly to remote communities providing medical services and patient transport. Without masks pilots have been unable to fly into these communities with the danger of spreading the COVID-19 virus. Please see the attached photos of my son Peter handing over the masks to Esther.

Many thanks to you Eric and the Rotary Club of Hong Kong North Point for offering these lifesaving masks through Rotary and IFFR.

We have dispatched the remaining 800 masks from our Rotary District DIK warehouse to Darwin where they will be flown to Dili, TL by a charter flight and will be received by the Australian Embassy for distribution to Dili medical clinics.

Because of COVID -19, Timor Leste is completely locked down and we believe they require PPE eg. face masks, gloves cover-all suits etc.

Through our Rotary Club and District, we are endeavouring to obtain more specific requirements.

For Q2.

For technologies relating to green/sustainable buildings, it is primarily focused on (1) energy & (2) recycling.

For energy, solar panels and clear glass solar windows pricing have dropped more than 40% in the past decade which has made it more viable for incorporation. Due to the cost, it is still not meaningful to install into residential buildings as it significantly increases cost of construction along with the need of regular maintenance. Solar panels and clear glass solar windows are better fitted for commercial, industrial and retail properties. What had made renewable energy more viable over the past 5 years is the innovations introduced by EATON Corp, TESLA and SAMSUNG SDI. GARY, could you find out what innovations were introduced by EATON CORP, TELSA and SAMSUNG SDI in the past 5yrs that has made renewable energy more feasible in buildings?

For recycling, there has not been much innovations introduced in the past 15yrs as a viable economic model are yet to be found. DS Smith Plc and Worley has been working on it over the years and so far, little success

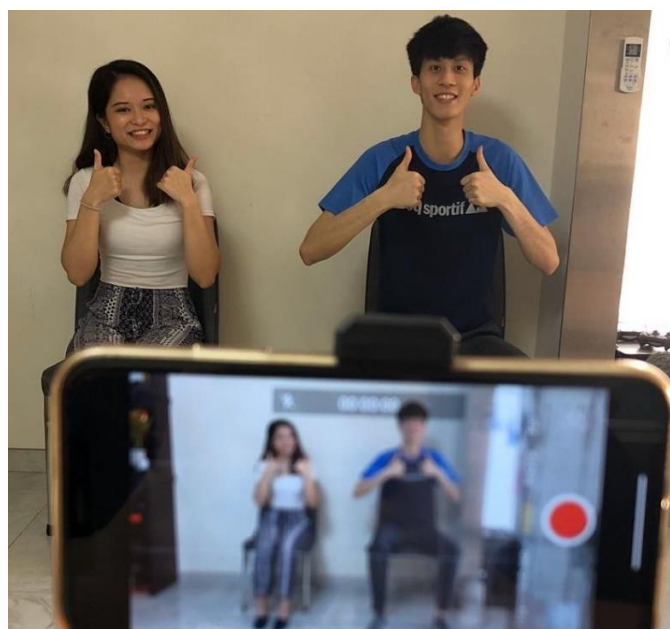

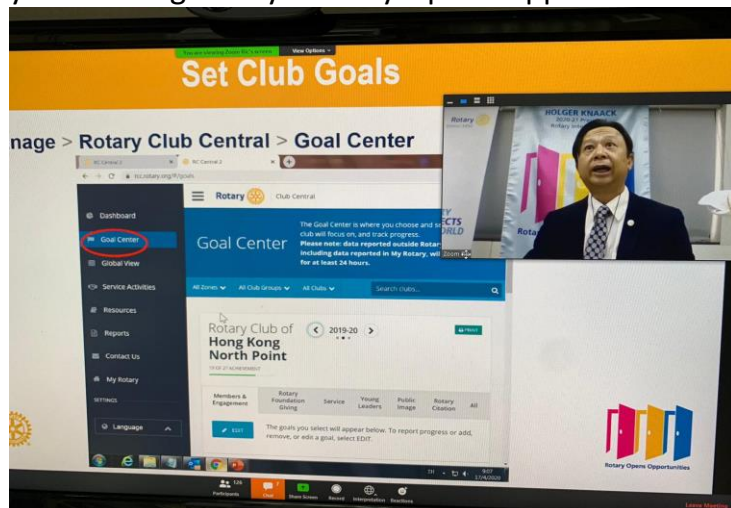

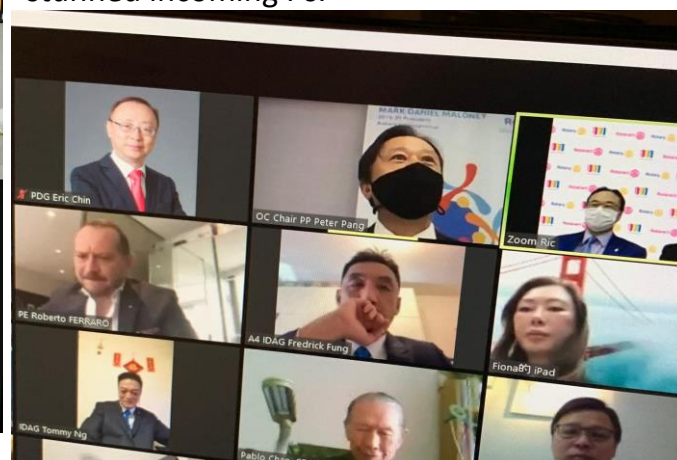

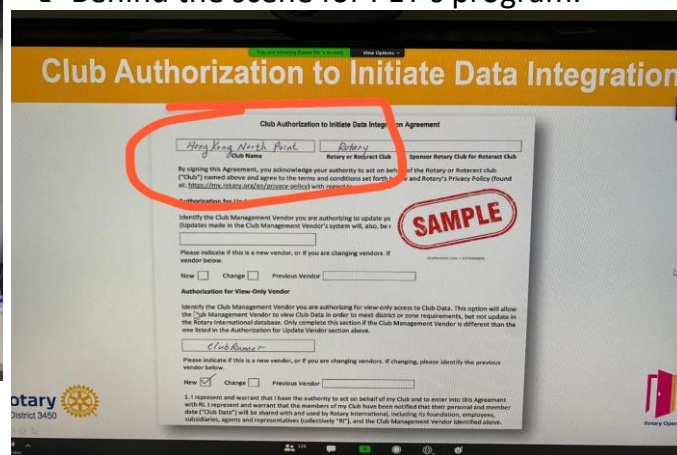

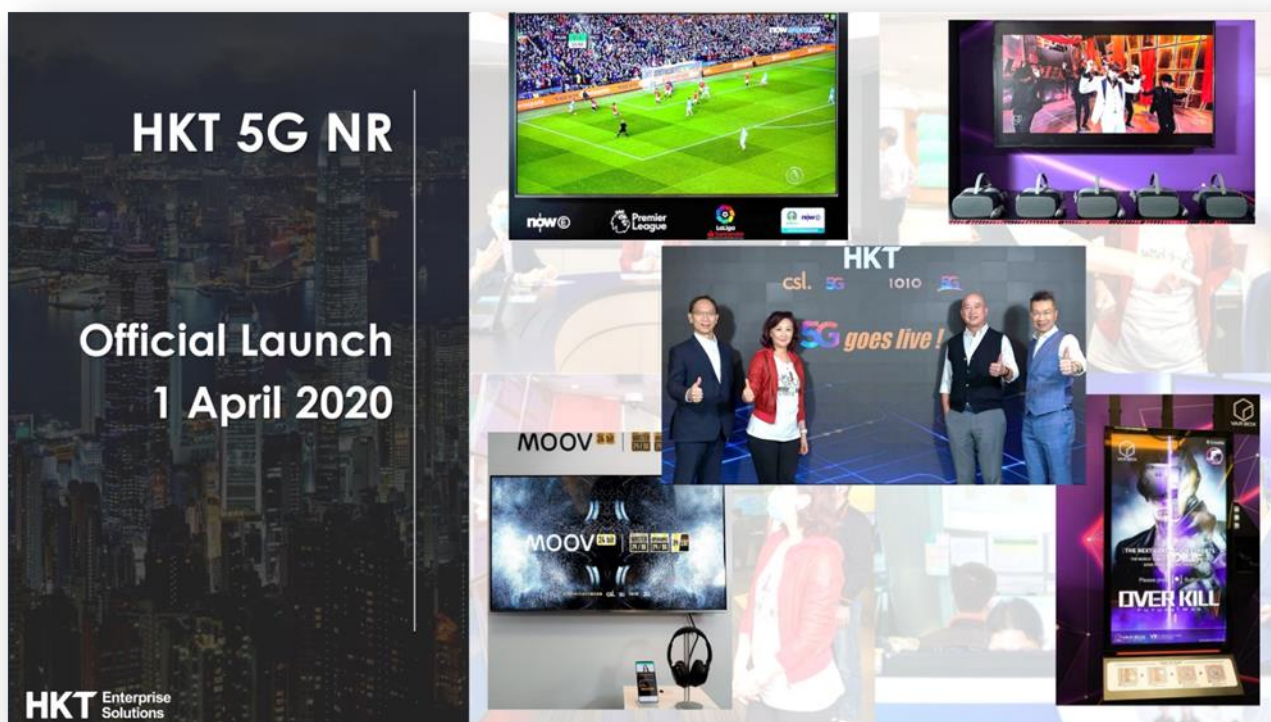
ONLINE MONTHLY MEETING 16th APRIL: 5G ERA FOR TOMORROW

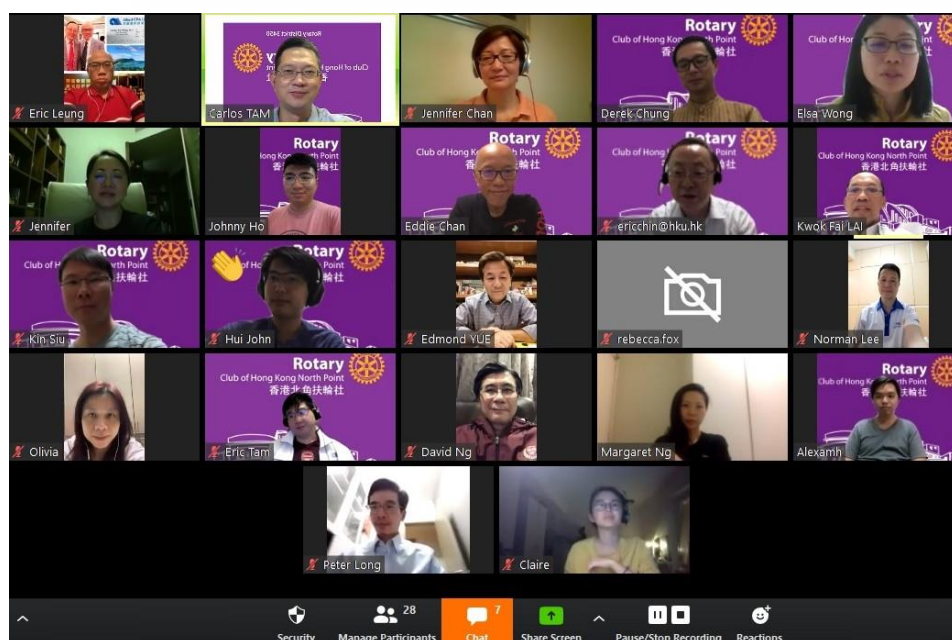
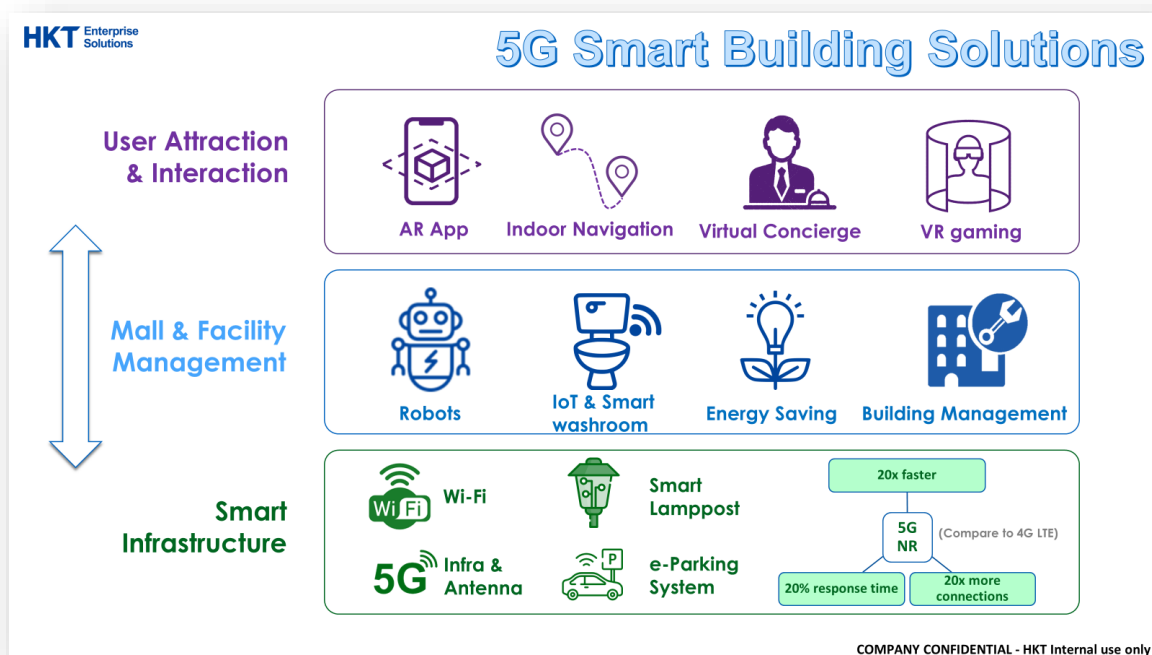

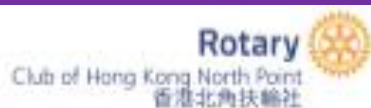
